



The Rights of Children



These laws refer to all children without exception, without discrimination based on race, colour, sex, language, religion, political opinion, national or social origins, means, birth, or any other situation.

These laws refer to the children themselves and their family.

Each child is entitled to :

- have a name and a nationality, from the moment he was born,
- get free medical care,
- have a healthy food and a decent accomodation,
- learn how to read, how to write and how to count, for free,
- live with their parents,
- believe in the religion of their choice,
- to play and enjoy themselves,
- and to get the treatment, the education and the specific care which are needed if they are physically, mentally or socially handicapped.

Each child must be protected against :

- sexual abuse,
- kidnapping,
- slavery,
- torture,
- unfair imprisonment,
- excessive exploitation, especially concerning work,
- and against all kinds of carelessness and cruelty.

The first duty of a child is to respect the rights of others, so :

Each adult person is expected to teach children a spirit of comprehension, of tolerance, of friendship between peoples, of universal peace and fraternity, and to devote their energy and talents to their fellow human beings.
